





Known for its one-of-a-kind homes and national design and build services, Green Baybased Wisconsin Log Homes was chosen by the couple to turn their visions into a reality.



says Ehren Graf, home consultant at Wisconsin Log Homes. Each hybrid home the company builds is unique to its owner and its site. For instance, Graf adds, "We are currently working on a very modern design that combines timbers, stucco, stone, and metal, and was created to blend with its suburban neighborhood. Another plan we are finalizing will be a rustic retreat decked out in logs on a secluded piece of property in the mountains." The company's hybrids are also popular worldwide, being built in other continents like Asia and Europe.

Steven and Diana had very specific ideas for their home. Utilizing the company's hybrid system, the couple opted for a mix of logs and drywall. The system gives you the freedom to use wood, stone, metal, or any other material you prefer as accents in a way that is effective and dramatic, without being overwhelming. "A lot of people have determined that there is such a thing as too much wood in a home," says Graf, "Do you really need beams on the laundry room ceiling? Our system allows you to mix and match whatever materials you like, wherever you like."

As for Steven and Diana's home, handscribed saddle-notch logs and heavy window trim set a refined rustic tone on the exterior, echoing the surrounding forest. Handcrafted round log posts flank the canopy entry with double doors that welcome guests into an angled foyer with views of the impressive wood and metal staircase and soaring great room.

Inside, handcrafted log trusses support the twenty-five-foot-tall great room ceiling, while heavy wood trim outlines the wall of windows, creating a sense of awe and spaciousness.

For the decor, the couple wanted a cowboy western look to remind them of their favorite vacations out West. "We brought the West to us," says Steven. "Now every time I pull into my driveway, I feel like I'm on vacation. It's so different from living in a regular house."

A kitchen where everyone could congregate and enjoy spending time together was a must. An expert cook, Diana designed the kitchen to her specific needs, with plenty of workspace and wonderful appliances just steps away from a huge walk-in pantry.
